Celebrating our Constitution

In 1955, the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) imitated the observance of the framing of the Constitution with a yearly observance on September 17-23. The celebration's goals are: to encourage the study of the historical events that led to the framing of the Constitution on September 17, 1787; to remind the public that the Constitution is the foundation for our way of life and to emphasize US citizens' responsibility to protect, defend and preserve the US Constitution.

September 17 – on this day in 1787, the framing of the Constitution was announced at 4:00 p.m. to the waiting crowds in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The ringing of bells was part of the response to this announcement and is commemorated with an annual ceremony.

5:00 p.m.

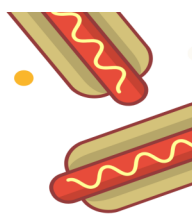
Bring your bicycle, and join us for a ride around the Ocala Historic District!
